

OLIMPIADE 1994

Die agste Geskiedenisolimpiade het weer eens besonder suksesvol verloop. Onder die medaljewenners het 'n aantal nuwe skole na vore getree terwyl ou staatmakers soos King Edward VII, King David en Rondebosch Boys' High weer onder die medaljewenners is. Twee Vrystaatse skole, die Kroonstad en Harrismithse hoërskole, is vir die eerste keer onder die medaljewenners. Dit is besonder bemoedigend omdat so min Vrystaatse skole aan die Olimpiade deelneem.

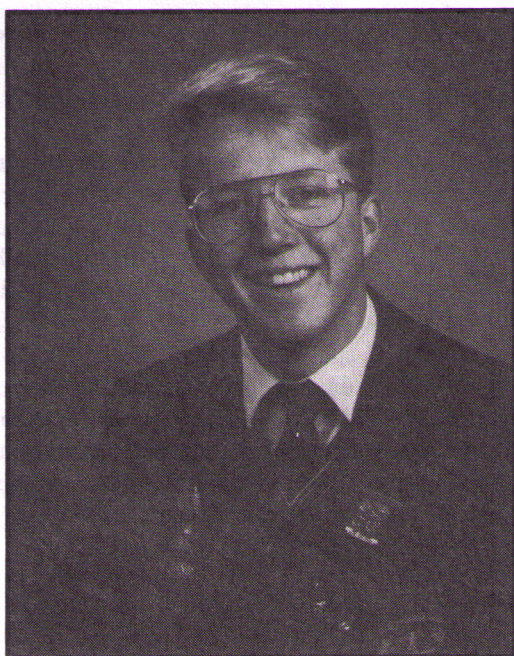
Die wenners was soos volg:

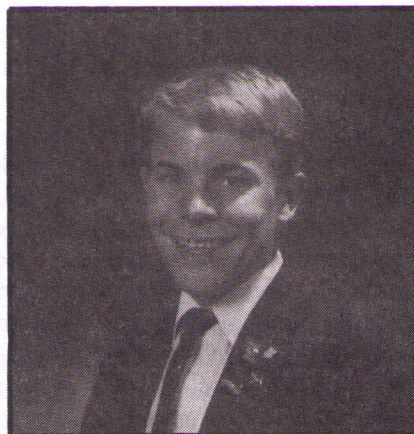

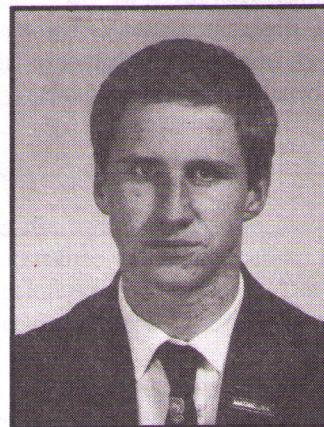
Wenner van die Goue Medalje Leon van Rensburg van die Hoërskool Transvalia, Vanderbijlpark.

The ten medal winners achieved an average score of 80% in the second round of the Olympiad which compares exceptionally favourable with previous years. In steep contrast, however, is the absence of girls amongst the top ten. This is the second time in the history of the Olympiad that the girls were unable to put their stamp on the competition.

The Olympiad is well supported. In the first round 2083 pupils from 219 schools participated. The fifty seven top scores went through to the second round. They represented 34 schools. What is most remarkable is that the 57 included 4 std 9 pupils, 1 std 8 and 1 std 7 pupil. The average score in the second round was 65% compared with the 80% of the medal winners.
